- .Summer baseball/softball registration has ended

The Parks Department is beginning to pick up business for the season. The weathers has put a damper on things as it does every spring.

- . We have done some mowing when the weather has let us.

- . We have received word that the city will be planting 62 trees in our parks. Trees to be planted include: Bald Cypress (Taxodium distich) 4, Chinkapin Oak (Quercus muehlenbergil) 12, Cherrybark Oak (Quercus pagoda) 11, Black Gum (Nyssa sylvatica) 3, Black Oak (Quercus veluntina) 12, Post Oak (Quercus stellata) 8, Ohio Buckeye (Aesculus glabra) 12

OLD BUSINESS

The following item was discussed: Replacing or repairing picnic tables in Laughlin Park.

There are 3 picnic tables by the handicapped fishing area. One is intact and is not in need of repair. Of the other 2 tables, one needs totally replaced and another one needs either replaced altogether or replace one bench.

Bonnie submitted 3 estimates for totally replacing both tables with benches.

- Smith reported Murdon Concrete in ST. James would not be available to pour new tables and benches.
- Smith also mentioned getting students from WCC involved. Bonnie will check to see if this is possible.
